HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

At this point in the year, it is good to reflect on the school vision, that was created with our whole school community, and how we are progressing with it (you can remind yourselves of what we agreed on the next page). We wanted to be: 'A school that teaches everyone to have a positive impact on the world'.

At school over the last few weeks we have been working on this by focusing on our 'Stocks Green Way'. These are the social norms that we want everyone at Stocks Green to demonstrate every day. We have been revisiting these to provide clarity to everyone on what they look like and how we can show them every day. We have started with two simple social norms that make a huge impact for everyone. 1) 'We walk calmly on the left' and 2) 'We look after our environment'.

In assembly last week, we talked about what these look like, such as never walking past something on the ground, taking pride in our school environment as well as looking after the things we have. It has been wonderful to see the children in the school looking after their cloakrooms, classrooms and corridors with so much more pride. They have also been heard reminding each other to walk calmly, particularly when they have been coming in for lunch. It is amazing how quickly you can make a big impact when everyone is working together. It has been wonderful to see the whole school community pull together and push each other to make a positive impact on the environment inside the school.

DEVELOPING PROJECTS

Mr. Endersby, Mr. Mitchell, Mrs. Mitchell and I have been busy working on the water play area. The PTA have very kindly funded this work and it is taking shape. This will be a water play area where children can safely play with water, race ducks down pipes and generally have great fun! We will be treating the water to keep it clean and emptying it on a regular basis. We hope to have this project completed in the next few weeks and I look forward to sharing some pictures of the children enjoying it.

Mr. Till has also been creating a stand for the play boat. This is also nearly ready. The donor will be coming in shortly to add the mast (no sail) and we will then be making last minute adjustments to fit in with our OPAL Risk Benefit Assessment (which we use to assess all OPAL activities). Again, this will be an incredible play resource for the pupils and I know they will get great pleasure from it.

Our website is also very nearly ready after a year of hard work in the background, last summer, Ms. Peake very kindly took photographs for us and I look forward to sharing the final result with you at the end of June (hopefully!).

CLIMATE ACTION PLAN

Every school is now required to have a Climate Action Plan. As with any project here at Stocks Green Primary School, we always think about how anything we are required to do can fit within our own vision. Climate action fits well within our vision of a school that teaches children to have a positive impact on the world. As part of this climate action plan, I recently met with Suzie Hammond (the lead advisor for Kent) who has helped us to shape some initial projects. Last week, Anna, from RHS and Suzie came in to work with Year 1 and Year 5 as part of this exciting project.

In Year 1, Anna talked to the learners about habitats. We have wooded and grassy habitat in our school grounds. They did a minibeast hunt in the Forest School area. She challenged them to find worms, slugs, snails and birds.

She brought two soft toys, a Fox and a toy hedgehog and split the class into groups. They were then challenged to build a habitat for their animal using the things they could find in our grounds. They created a stick house for the fox - for protection and hiding - and catkin beds for the hedgehog - to keep warm during hibernation. The Year Is had an amazing time and learnt so much about habitats!

Year 5 also worked with Anna and Suzie to start mapping the school grounds onto the RHS National Park Project. The children were extremely enthusiastic about the project and will continue the mapping over the coming weeks.
