HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Three weeks into January and I am convinced we have not seen the sun once! Luckily, the sunny disposition of the children remains as they continue to enjoy their learning and grow within our school community.

In assembly this week, we focused on 'doing the right thing because it is the right thing to do.' We talked about how no matter who was watching or what was going on around us, doing the right thing is always the right thing to do. We looked at examples of how keeping our school environment clean and clear of litter is always the right thing to do. This moved onto an exploration of how litter can impact on the environment and cause wildlife all sorts of issues as it travels into the environment and the children were all shocked by the damage it could cause in the oceans.

We also looked at other examples around the school about how being kind is always the right thing to do. We also looked at inclusivity and how being welcoming to new members of our school community is always the right thing to do and how we can make people feel welcomed and supported.

We also talked about how everyone can help in our school by supporting tidying up in classrooms or ensuring that everything was put away carefully during OPAL play. Following on from this assembly, it made me really proud to hear about the actions of some of our pupils.

At lunchtime, we have had to shut more and more of our field as it has become unusable due to the incredible amount of standing water. The children were all really disappointed that we might have to close off the swing area and bunker temporarily. So, a huge team of them helped wheelbarrow woodchip across the waterlogged field to help dry out areas and reduce the mud. This made me so proud that these children wanted to make the play experiences of everyone else better and that they gave up their time to support Mr. Endersby to make this happen.

This really shows why 'doing the right thing because it is the right thing to do' is so important and how, when we work together, we can make the school a better place for everyone. I would really encourage all parents to help us reinforce this message around doing the right thing because it is the right thing to do with their children, as together we can make such a difference.
