Dear Parents, Carers and Staff

As we experience life with its ups and downs, twists and turns, we have come to realise that the ability to adapt and respond to change is vital if we are to progress and achieve our goals.

On behalf of the Governors we would like to express our thanks and appreciation to Mrs Crowhurst who, as you know, will be retiring at the end of her 10 year tenure as Headteacher of Stocks Green Primary School. In particular we would like to take this opportunity to commend her strength and resilience in her pursuit to keep pupils, staff and families safe during the very difficult times caused by the Covid pandemic.

Our best wishes and thanks also go to Mrs Johnson, Mr Irving, and Mrs Hollander who are retiring and Mrs Bass who will be moving on to pastures new.

This year we have welcomed three new governors to our team, elected Parent Governors Rebecca Mackay and William Moore, and Alan McLean who has joined as a Co-opted Governor.

Strategic Priorities

At the end of this current academic year it is evident that learning to live with Covid will continue to present challenges, however as a school we can celebrate a year of returning to fulltime education in the classroom, the reinstatement of enrichment activities and welcoming parents and carers back into school. As Governors, we have also returned to holding full Governing body (FGB) and committee meetings in school, which has made a welcome change from Zoom.

We have continued to monitor the agreed areas for school improvement which include the 6 main priority areas of Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development, Leadership and Management, Early Years Foundation Stage and Building and Grounds. The Full Governing Body Minutes provide a record of how, as Governors, we hold school to account and monitor progress against the agreed priorities. A main Governing priority this year has been to appoint a new Headteacher for September 2022. This process commenced at the end of December 2022 and was successfully concluded in April this year with the appointment of Mr Hipkiss.

In the DfE school's white paper setting out a long-term vision for a school system that helps every child to fulfil their potential, strong leadership and governance are recognised as critical in advancing educational outcomes for children.

Safeguarding

Governors have ensured that the school fulfills the duty of care through its policies and protocols and above all, training for staff.

The following policies have been reviewed and agreed this year Child Protection, Behaviour, Anti-Bullying, Online Safety, AUPs - Acceptable Use Policies, Looked after children, SEND Information Report, Safer Recruitment, Complaints, Whistle Blowing, SEND Information Report, Staff Code of Conduct and Governors Code of Conduct.

Staff and Governors have undergone Prevent and safeguarding training.

The key safeguarding document Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) has been updated for September 2022. The KCSIE document is statutory guidance for schools, colleges and other institutes of education and it is put together by the Department of Education. It applies to all school staff as well as to governing bodies and it sets out the legal duties which must be followed to ensure the correct safeguarding of children under the age of 18.

Thank you to the PTA

We wish to formally thank the PTA on everyone's behalf for their continued hard work, dedication and enthusiasm. This academic year, they have raised a grand total of £9,100!

With PTA donations school has been able to purchase a new support reading scheme, classroom resources, Y6 leavers' books and a financial contribution will be made towards the development and extension of the Outdoor Learning area. Numerous events and activities have taken place, Present fair, Winter Ball, Cinema night, raffle, bags2school collection, sponsored run, cake and uniform sales. Once more families and staff were able to join together on a relaxing sunny Saturday afternoon at the Summer Fair.
