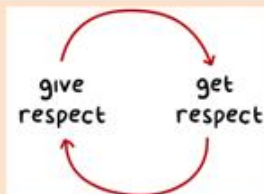

About Our School



Stocks Green Primary School provides education for girls and boys aged from 4 - 11 years. Our capacity is 218 children, in classes of 30 in Key Stage 1 and 32 in Key stage 2. Although our school is non-denominational, we actively foster links within the local community, including the local church, farmers market and any other local projects that we can be involved in!

The school opened in 1969. Since then, it has remained at the heart of the community of Hildenborough and has welcomed students from further afield.

Our school includes seven spacious classrooms and a large hall for a single form entry school. As a school that prides itself on being inclusive, we have a care suite fully equipped for supporting those with additional needs, complete with a shower facility and hoist. Two of our Key Stage 2 classrooms have been extended to enable easier accessibility for pupils with specific needs. The Foundation Stage classroom has a covered outside learning area. Each classroom has an outdoor canopy to allow an element of outdoor learning, whatever the weather! The school houses a large music room/library, which is used for various purposes.



Despite only being one-form entry, the school is lucky enough to have extensive grounds. This includes a large and exciting Forest School area, which all children in Reception and Key Stage 1 get to explore and learn in. Our active PTA have funded a fantastic dipping platform for our wildlife pond that the children can use to enrich their science learning. We also have a wildlife area, an allotment, outdoor stage, designated quiet areas and adventure playground equipment.

Sport and exercise are an important part of our school ethos and our grounds have a range of facilities, including an all year running track, football/rugby pitch, athletics track, rounders pitch, outdoor table tennis tables and netball and basketball courts. We also have the use of portable tennis nets in the summer.

Pupils like learning and the school has high expectations for them. They find their work interesting and experiences memorable. They behave well in lessons and are keen to do well. Pupils are motivated by choosing ways of demonstrating their knowledge for example through maths challenges or devising projects to answer 'The Big Question' in history.



Pupils are positive about the changes that have been made to their playtimes. Buddies

In Reception, you will be assigned a Year 6 buddy to take care of you, help you make friends and help you settle in to this wonderful school! Before long, your child and their allocated buddy will have enjoyed many fun activities to help them bond!



Houses

Curriculum

The curriculum at Stocks Green is always fun and engaging. We learn a range of different subjects that are always interesting, and there is never a subject that is boring. In school, we learn the core subjects such as English and maths. We also learn history, geography, RE, DT, PE and PSHE. In the higher years, you learn French too.

When you start in Year R, you learn the Early Years Curriculum, learning numbers, simple phonic sounds and how the world works.

Early Foundations



In the Early Years Foundation Stage we aim to guide and support children's development shaping them for life as well as giving them the essential tools for learning. We believe that quality early years education is about children having the opportunity to solve problems and be creative in every area of their learning, as well as thriving in the safe, stimulating and exciting environment provided for them. We recognise

the importance of the first year of school and hope to inspire the children to become life-long learners. We believe that every child is an individual and we aim to provide them with the best start to their school journey. We all love to learn in a fun, interactive and stimulating way both indoors and outdoors. We deliver this whilst supporting children to develop and be the best that they can be.

A Day in the Life of Our Reception Class



From the moment we say goodbye to our adults at the gate, it is all go in Year R!

We come into class and self-register by finding our name on an apple and then we choose what we are having for lunch that day. We have to hang our coats up on our pegs and then we begin to empty our book bags. Our water bottles go in the correct team box and then, if we have read our 'choosing books' at home, we can change it for another book from the book area. Then our book bag goes into our team's book box. After that, we are ready to play with our friends.

We have lots of different areas to play inside our classroom: the book area, writing area, creative area, construction area and role play area. Then, of course, there is also our outdoor classroom with a sand area, construction area, writing area, role play house, bug garden, mud kitchen, stone area and our amazing climbing tree. In all these different areas, we have learnt how to select and use the resources independently. Our teachers also provide special activities that are linked to our own interests, our current topic work or provide opportunities to practice our previous learning.



As our school has amazing grounds, we often get to explore our school environment. We use the playground to zoom around on our large wheeled toys.

We also get to go and explore the fantastic Forest School.



After playtime, it is then time to tidy up, so we are ready to enjoy our healthy fruit snacks and milk. Then we go outside with the older children for playtime, supported by our Year 6 buddies.

When we return to class, it is time for whole class learning, so we sit on a picture of a piece of fruit on the carpet. Our teachers make our learning very fun and engaging and we don't sit still for long! Then we work in small groups with our teachers to reinforce our work class work. This will include written tasks but also lots of fun practical activities and games. Then we are ready for lunch!

We eat lunch in the hall with the other children in Key Stage 1. Our midday meal supervisors know us all very well and, after lunch, takes us into the playground where we get a chance to play with our Year 6 buddies and all of the other children during our OPAL lunchtime.

Our afternoons begin with the register and then we do some more whole class learning. Then we have a mixture of adult play based activities and free play. This mix will decrease from free play to more directed tasks as the year progresses. As we near the end of the afternoon, we have to tidy up our classroom and then we have an afternoon snack of raisins or a breadstick. Then we always end our day with a story and prepare for home time. No wonder we are tired when we get home!

Beyond the School Day

Early Morning Club

The school runs its own early morning club. This starts at 7:45 am and is run by members of the school team. Children are engaged in a variety of fun activities. Please note that there is no breakfast or food provided at this club. The cost to attend is £3.50 per session.

After School Club

An external provider (Rainbows) offers an after-school club onsite. The sessions run from 3:15pm to 6:00 pm. The club runs on weekdays during term time and currently costs £12 per session. Rainbows provide a light snack for children after school, such as a Croissant, flapjack, cheese and a piece of fruit.

Our Curriculum

'Learning to Live, Living to Learn'



Our school motto 'Learning to Live, Living to Learn' is very much at the core of our curriculum. We aim to provide a curriculum that equips pupils with life skills for the future at all levels.

Our curriculum is designed to:

- recognise children's prior learning
- provide first hand learning experiences
- promote creativity
- make connections between subjects and real life
- Promote safe, equal, caring and enjoyable relationships and discussing real-life situations appropriate to the age and stage of pupils.
- encourage the children to develop interpersonal skills
- build resilience and become creative, critical thinkers.
- understand their own strengths and areas for development and know how to face challenges
- promote responsibility for learning and future success.

The ability to learn is underpinned by the teaching of basic skills, knowledge, concepts and values. This involves developing learning attitudes and resilience – acquiring an understanding that we learn from occasional mistakes made. Teaching the skills of interacting with others, questioning, reasoning and explaining help to create a positive attitude to learning.



OPAL

As a school, we believe that every aspect of the children's day should be exciting, productive and help to build memories that last a lifetime. Across their time in school, children spend 20% of it playing. This equates to an incredible 1.4 years of their time in school. As such, we felt that this was an area of school life that we had to make exciting and we decided to work alongside a company called OPAL



(<https://outdoorplayandlearning.org.uk/>) to reinvigorate our lunchtime provision and provide children with opportunities to manage their own risks and explore play in a carefully thought out environment. The OPAL project is now well-embedded within the school and children report having a significantly better and exciting lunch time experience.

What does this look like in practice? Playtimes at Stocks Green Primary School are incredibly diverse and exciting. We have children in full dress up outfits, cycling or scooting across the playground, swinging or jumping out of trees, finding a quiet corner to enjoy a book or playing with Lego or board games. At other times, we might have children creating courses for water to travel down in the rain, playing sports, painting or drawing, creating images out of chalk or build Forest School style dens. The potential for play on our vast site is limitless and we maximise every opportunity to increase our options for play. The children have access to our sprawling grounds and fields all year round and bring in wellies and an old coat to play in. Some children love to dance along to the music or pop bubbles when we have our bubble machine out.

OPAL has been one of the best projects we have embarked on as a school and this was confirmed by a visitor from another school who said, 'I have never seen a school where all children are so involved in play at lunchtime before.' If you decided to send your child to Stocks Green, they will benefit from the incredible play provision that we have on offer at the school.

Admissions

In our reception class, children are admitted into the school on a staggered, part-time basis, during Term 1. This follows a similar process to most local schools and allows the children settling in time as they get used to a new and exciting learning environment.

We follow the Kent recommended admission policy for community schools. All applications are considered and, if there are more applications than places, the following criteria is applied in order of priority.

- children who are currently in care
- current family association, i.e. an elder brother or sister in the school at the time of entry
- health reasons (for which a medical certificate may be needed)
- proximity to the school

Information to be aware of:

- **Proof of residency will be required on application and entry – without this a place cannot be offered.**
- The address must be the residence of the parent(s)/guardian(s) and the child (i.e. where child and parent are living) by Wednesday 15th January 2025 (the deadline for submitting your application). It should be either owned by the child's parent(s) or guardian(s), leased or rented by the child's parent(s) or guardian(s) under a lease or written rental agreement.

- Depending on your circumstances, there is a possibility that you own a property near to a school that you may express a preference for, but live elsewhere. Please be aware that you should not use this address unless you are actually living in it, and it is your main residence as defined above.
- Any residential move which takes place between Wednesday 15th January 2025 and the end of the first school term will be investigated to establish if a short term let has been taken for the purpose of securing a school place outside of the families intended residential area. If the Governing Body consider this to be the case it may consider the application at the time to have been misleading and may withdraw the school place even after the child has started at school. (from KCC admissions guidance)

To apply for a school place in our Reception Class, parents will need to complete an online admission form at <https://kent.cloud.servelec-synergy.com/Synergy/Admissions.aspx>. The application window opens on 5th November. Clear details are given on the form regarding the date of return and when parents will be informed of the admission decision for their child.

There is a pre-school on the site, which is run independently – Stocks Green Pre-school. Website: www.sgps.wordpress.com. As the pre-school is independent of the school, attending the pre-school does not form part of our admissions criteria.

Before starting school, the Reception Class teacher will arrange to meet with each child's parents to talk about their child.

Following government guidelines, a baseline assessment takes place in term 1. However, the school focuses on making this as relaxed and engaging for the pupils as possible and the children have no idea that an assessment is taking place.

Moving on from Stocks Green

At the age of eleven, the children move on to secondary schools. There is a wide range of schools to choose from including comprehensive, church schools, academies and grammar schools. Parents can opt for their child to take the Kent Selection Test (which takes place early in September), if they wish their child to be considered for a grammar school place.

The children from Stocks Green have transferred on to a wide range of secondary schools in the past 5 years.

Homework

We encourage parents to be involved with the activities their child undertakes at school. One way parents are expected to help is with homework.

In the Reception Class this will mean sharing a book with a parent, relative or sibling and practising letter sounds learned at school.

In the infant and junior classes, class teachers set reading, spelling and multiplication tables to be learned each week. In Year 5 and 6 there is a more formal maths homework set weekly in line with our homework policy. For those who wish to extend their learning further, there is option homework tasks set by each teacher on the school website.

Homework is set weekly throughout the year to support learning and progression. Homework is set on a Monday and should be completed by the following Monday. It is school policy not to set homework during the school holidays, as children need a rest too!

Assemblies

The 1988 Education Reform Act requires all schools to provide a daily act of collective worship that is "wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character". We live in a multi-faith society and all aspects of assemblies are taught in an informative, unbiased manner. We believe young people need to be informed in order to make decisions in later life and we encourage understanding and tolerance of people's beliefs and views.

The sessions vary in style and involve the children whenever possible. They are non-denominational and usually include a story, or scenario for discussion and a song and sometimes a prayer or a thought/reflection. The stories may have a moral which encourage the children to reflect on their own lives, or may tell of a significant figure or event in a variety of belief systems. The whole school celebration assembly is a time when children share their achievements with the rest of the school.

The school also has special assemblies provided once per term by the local church, St. Johns, as well as a company called High Hopes. These focus on the Christian faith. The school ensures that other faiths are represented through the themed Headteacher assemblies.

Parents have the right to withdraw their child from religious based collective worship, although they should discuss this action with the Headteacher prior to a decision being made.

Parent Support

Parents are warmly welcomed as helpers at Stocks Green. Currently parents help with reading, classroom activities, in the school library, provide transport for matches and help with supervision for swimming and educational visits. Your assistance is always valued and appreciated. If you are able to help in any way, please contact the school.

All parent helpers are required to complete a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check before working with children.

School Meals

As with all schools, children in Year R and Key Stage 1 are entitled to a Universal Infant Free School Meal.

Children may bring their own lunch to school or order a cooked meal from the kitchen. All school meals are cooked to the latest Government nutritional standards and cost £2.96 per meal, for children in Years 3 to 6. Our meals are prepared on site by 'Nourish', our caterers.

Snacks and Milk

We subscribe to the Free Fruit and Vegetable scheme for children in Year R, 1 and 2 and all these children will be offered a mid-morning snack. Children in Years 3 to 6 may bring in their own fruit or vegetables for their snack.

Stocks Green provides a milk scheme that is available to all of our pupils. School milk is free for children under 5, and for those over 5 it is available at a subsidised price, which is currently 28p per day.

PTA

We are fortunate to have a very active Parent Teacher Association that raises additional funds for the school. Activities organised include really enjoyable social events for the children, as well as for parents, such as discos, parties, Christmas and summer fairs, Easter egg hunts and the Spring Ball.

Our PTA are a very valuable part of our school and without their support we would not be able to fund all the exciting projects that we have planned each year.
